“The idea of deserting is ‘transferring your allegiance’ and is used of soldiers who revolt or desert; men who change sides in war, politics or philosophy. It can mean a ‘renegade’ or a ‘turncoat’. The Galatians were in the process of becoming spiritual deserters from the Gospel of grace. They were about to become renegades to the true Gospel and turncoats for a false Gospel.” **Dr. Jack Arnold**

Acts 20:28-32

“Pay careful attention to yourselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood. ²⁹I know that after my departure fierce wolves will come in among you, not sparing the flock; ³⁰and from among your own selves will arise men speaking twisted things, to draw away the disciples after them. ³¹Therefore be alert, remembering that for three years I did not cease night or day to admonish every one with tears. ³²And now I commend you to God and to the word of his grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified.”

There are over 200 denominations in the United States alone and all are claiming their group has the truth. Some of these groups disagree as to the method or way of salvation in the Christian religion. Who do we believe? Which group is right? What is our authority?

Judaizers

The Judaizers were a faction of the Jewish Christians, both of Jewish and non-Jewish origins, who regarded the Levitical laws of the Old Testament as still binding on all Christians. They tried to enforce Jewish circumcision upon the Gentile converts to early Christianity and were strenuously opposed and criticized for their behavior by the Apostle Paul.

Substitutions, Perversions, Distortions

Galatians 1:8-9

“But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed (eternally condemned). ⁹ As we have said before, so now I say again: If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be accursed.”

“Notice what Paul is NOT saying. He is NOT condemning infidels, agnostics, and atheists for false teaching, but men who claimed to be Christians. The Judaizers believed in Christ but believed in law-works as a cause of salvation. Anyone who rejects the true gospel and teaches a false gospel is to be rejected. If ANYONE brings a gospel other than the Gospel preached by the Apostles and recorded in the New Testament, it is to be rejected and so are false teachers to be rejected.” Dr. Jack Arnold

2) How to avoid being a “MAN-PLEASER”?

Mark 12:28-31

“And one of the scribes came up and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, asked him, ‘Which commandment is the most important of all?’²⁹ Jesus answered, ‘The most important is, ‘Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one.’³⁰ And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.’³¹ The second is this: ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ There is no other commandment greater than these.’”
